keepSIX opened its doors on November 27, 2017

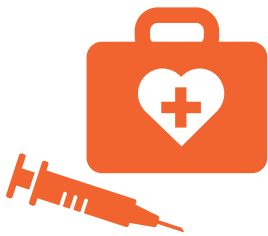

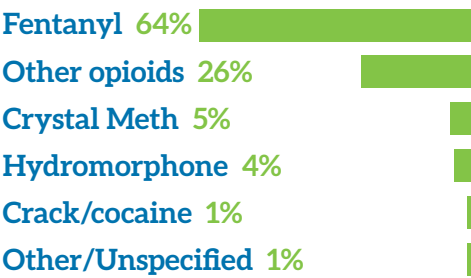
